FIRE LOOKOUT SNOWSHOE

During the early 20th century fire lookouts spread across the Northwest region, well, like wildfire. Starting with the first was constructed in 1920, followed by hundreds more by mid century. Enough were built so that any given fire could be triangulated (located) from two or three different stations. The vast majority of these stations were built in Washington Oregon and Idaho. Their construction and manning provide some remarkable stories of construction, survival, and heroism which headlined news stories of the day like the one on the summit of Mt. Hood, the lightning strikes on Mt. Pough, and others. These were built before the invention of the helicopter so all materials had to be hauled up to precarious mountain tops by hand. The remarkable men and women that built and manned these stations were a hardy breed. only a few stations remain from this unique legacy. Join us as we snowshoeing in to spend a night at a Northern Oregon fire lookout and get a glimpse of what it might have been like to spend a summer with the world's best view just outside your front door.
